

How to reset/check that Windows 2000 is in DHCP Mode

Click "Start", "Settings", "Control Panel".

Look for the "Network and Dial-up Connections" Icon, and open it.

Find the TCP/IP protocol for the EtherNet card. Highlight it, and click the "Properties" button.

Make sure that the "Obtain an IP address automatically", and "Obtain DNS server address automatically" are both checked.

At this point we are ready to reset the system. Now click the "OK" button. It will return you to the "Local Area Connection" window. Once again click the "OK" button.

If this does not work shutdown the system to POWER OFF mode. Power back up and try again.
